

Creating a Global Curriculum

The pathway to a truly global curriculum begins by critically appraising what we expect our students to learn and why they should be learning it. But creating a global curriculum shouldn't just involve diversifying reading lists or integrating non-Western case studies into existing work schemes. Embracing global teaching methodologies and deconstructing traditional disciplinary thinking is an important part of this process too.

What are the aims of the session?


This training session will explore what a global curriculum might look like in practice. We will consider ways in which curriculum content might be adapted to consider a broad range of perspectives and identities across each subject area, focussing specifically on how we can engage each and every subject in the process of change. The session will explore how we can embrace global teaching methodologies in our classrooms, establishing the basis for authentic, lasting, change that will impact positively on our school community.

What will we do?

Our session will comprise three parts, each dedicated *what* we teach, *why* we teach it and *how* we teach. In each mini-session we will reflect on what our students are learning, engage with global teaching methodologies and consider new, transdisciplinary approaches to curriculum development. Every session will introduce practical strategies and techniques you can use to facilitate change in your school or classroom. The session will cover:

- What we mean by a global curriculum
- Engaging every subject in the process of change
- Co-option vs. collaboration: global teaching methodologies and indigenous knowledge systems
- Interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary approaches to a global curriculum
- Student-produced knowledge and curriculum planning and development.
